My concern is with the future of the Clearwater Airpark, which has prompted my interest in the Airpark lease. The Airpark has been on autopilot for the passed 22 years. I Have spent most of my adult life flying, promoting and managing Jet aviation companies, which has been a passion for me. A.

As a manager/owner of several FBO's and Charter companies over the past many years, I believe that the challenges of updating the Airpark would be easily accomplished with my plan of action. After reviewing the financial information and responsibilities provided by this RFP, I am positive that I have the intellectual, emotional and financial resources to successfully bring the Clearwater Airpark in the 21 century with the cooperation of the City of Clearwater.

B.

The project manager is the Team leader of the FBO office and the line service with excellent supervisory and communication skill. Understands the customer and is able to satisfy his requirements. He has worked in every position at the Clearwater Airpark and understands what the requirements are of other employees. This person is currently employed at the Airpark and is a 14 year veteran of service to the Airpark. His name is Luis E Freay and lives in Oldsmar, Florida. He intends to remain as FBO Manager.

C.

The present front line team members would be retained in their present positions. The scope and area of responsibilities for each employee will remain the same with no immediate changes. After a familiarization period, improvements maybe introduced in-reference to enhance safety and efficiency.

Tampa Bay aviation flight school and Bender Aviation Maintenance will also be considered to renew their lesses. This should be a seamless transition to a new Clearwater Airpark city lessee.

TAB 3

A.

The first order of business is to address the Airpark as a beautiful asset to the Clearwater Community. Improvements and renovations should be addressed in the order of making the grounds and fence areas look more presentable. Cleaning and painting some of the buildings where mother nature has taking her toll. Removing all derelict airplanes and vehicles. Bring the base customers on the airport together to discuss plans, hear out those who have desires and complaints. Discuss new plans for enhanced safety on and off the airport grounds, also reviewing the current TSA requirements for outlying airports in a metropolitan area.

B.

Establish goals to attract light jet and turbo prop aircraft to the airpark. Constructing a row of hangars along the west side of the runway in the golf course property as mentioned in the Airpark facilities implementation Plan {figure 3.14} would greatly enhance the Airpark as a Light Jet port.

1. Change the look and the amenities is the navigational publication such as "Fore Flight" and others which influence the operators of light jets and turbo-props to select Clearwater as their destination. Reacquire the RNAV instrument approach procedure to allow FAA Part 135 operations the ability to use The Airpark as a legal destination. And as referenced in the Airpark Layout plan secure more clearway space north of the runway to allow better access to the runway. If possible add 450 feet of payment to each end of runway. This increase makes the performance calculations more conducive to Jet aircraft.
2. Social media would be a large influence on the attention brought to the Airpark, which would help increase in fuel sale.

C.

At one time the Airpark had established rapport between City, the Airpark employees and tenants which no longer exists today. As the business increases, we will institute quarterly meetings to discuss the issues of noise and most importantly the safety issues created. The Christmas party and the pancake breakfasts will start again which builds camaraderie between the airport and the tenants and some of the surrounding residents.

D.

As stated above, the neighbors will be asked to participate in the quarterly meetings discussing safety and noise. And a meet and greet at the other functions....

Knowledge for these neighbors increasing understanding.

Compensation to the City.

A.

Proposed monthly payment.

The monthly payment is 30,000.00 per month plus tax room rental. Also the lessee agrees to pay {\$.15} per gallon fuel flow-age fee for all fuel delivers received at the Airpark up to 90,000 gallons. After 90,000 gallons the fuel flow-age fee is (\$.25}per gallon. The lessee agrees to pay sales tax on all rent and fee payments. The payment includes all costs associated with the airpark operation and the lease responsibilities inclusive of labor, equipment, supplies and management. The monthly rent payment shall increase yearly during the initial term and any renewal term by the latest yearly percent increase in the Finished Goods Producer Price Index {PPI-Commodities}. The annual increase shall be no less than {2%} even if no increase occurs. The annual increase shall shall be based on the latest index published and available ninety {90} days prior to the end of the agreement year then in effect compared to the index for the same Month one {1} year prior.

B.

Revenue Share program with the city cannot be determined at this time with the information presented in the RFP but will be considered at the time of the signing of the lease based on the fact that rental payments made to the lessee does not increase with economies of scale.

C.

Rental payments to the city will increase incrementally as the summary of recommendation are completed in the Airpark Layout Plan {2.8}.

D.

Compensation to the city will increase based on proposed rental property available to the lessee and also the increase in proposed increase fuel sales as these are base on incremental payments by the number of gallons of fuel sold.

He previously managed the park for Rick Emshoff, the previous lessee as well as another facility in Tampa.



Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
 - Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
 - Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
 - Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
 - Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
 - Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
 - Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
 - Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)
- Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.
