

We understand that improved mobility options for your residents often are reliant upon help from State appropriations. As the sole lobbying firm representing Manatee County, we have secured hundreds of millions of dollars to support multiple road projects within the County. Not only were we successful in obtaining funding within the final budget passed by the House and Senate, but we were successful in ensuring the projects were protected from line item veto by the Governor. On behalf of the Clearwater Ferry, we obtained \$1 million in our first year of representation. Working together with the City of Clearwater, we made the argument that alternative transportation solutions were needed to help alleviate traffic and parking issues within the City and on the beach.

When it comes to public safety, our team has been engaged with leadership in the House and Senate behind the scenes for the last few years, advocating for funding for the local government cybersecurity grant program and other cybersecurity initiatives. Our clients have served as experts, shaping the state's cybersecurity programs through the Legislature, and directly with leadership at the Florida Digital Service. As programs have been deployed, we have engaged directly with local governments and state agencies to help identify solutions to keep their systems and constituents safe. In addition, as the lobby firm for the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office, we have brought back millions of dollars to support water rescue in the Bay, a K-9 training facility, and most recently, a helicopter to service the entire region.

Our accomplishments on the City's goals do not end there. Over multiple Sessions, we have worked continuously to address access to affordable housing within our State. This has included securing full funding for the Sadowski Trust Fund to support the state's affordable housing programs, as well as obtaining \$2 million for Habitat for Humanity's efforts in Pinellas and West Pasco Counties. Most recently, we engaged to help pass legislation to make permanent an exemption for the state's Habitat for Humanity programs which allows them to broker mortgages at a lower cost, and ultimately helps

their homeowners. House Bill (HB) 1569 was passed unanimously by the House and Senate and signed into law by Governor DeSantis. We anticipate affordable and workforce housing will continue to be a priority for the Legislature, with additional changes to the Live Local legislation anticipated. This creates an immense opportunity for local governments to be involved in improving upon the original legislation.

On behalf of the American Flood Coalition, we led efforts this Session to secure \$100 million for the Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise Resilience Plan, which provides funding to local governments to assist with flood mitigation efforts. This is on top of \$20 million that was provided once again in the budget for local government planning grants. In addition, we led efforts to expand and improve the program through the Department of Environmental Protection's legislative package, HB 1557, and advocated for permanent funding from the Seminole Compact gaming revenues passed within Senate Bill (SB) 1638. Both bills were signed into law by the Governor.

Each year, we work to secure millions of dollars in appropriations on behalf of our clients, in every budget category. Our funding successes have helped to benefit law enforcement agencies, criminal justice workforce re- entry programs, water and sewer improvement projects, affordable housing programs, flood mitigation efforts, higher education capital outlay, performing arts centers, and countless other areas. Every budget year is different than the next, and we expect the next two to be more challenging based upon expected state revenues. Engaging a lobbying firm with the right relationships, and ability to offer behind-the-scenes navigation of the budget process, will be extremely important when seeking to obtain state funding.

Abilities




