3. Understanding of Services to be Performed and Approach to Meeting Requirements.

Lake and Wetland Management Services

Aquatic Systems will approach this program with 120 annual maintenance days, 10 maintenance days per month utilizing our ATV, Boat, Airboat, and Backpack application systems. Included within this action plan is:

- 12 annual treatment days (1x/month) to perform service to the 17 Lakes, Ponds, Right-of-Ways, and Parks and Recreational Areas due for 6 annual treatments per site.
- 60 annual treatment days (5x/month) for the 21 Lakes, Ponds, Ditch, Right-of-Ways, Parks and Recreational Areas, and Environmental/Stormwater Monitoring Facilities due for 12 annual treatments per site.
- 12 annual treatment days (3x/quarter or 1x/month) for the 9 Creeks, Channels, Ditches and Gabions due for 4 annual treatments per site.
- 24 annual treatment days (2x/month) for the 2 Environmental/Stormwater Monitoring Facilities due for 24 annual treatments per site.
- 12 annual treatment days (1x/month) utilizing our custom Airboat, to service any areas that require Airboat treatments.
- Additional requests for service will be provided to the City through verbal request, which will be responded to within 24 to 48 hours at no additional cost to the City of Clearwater.
- Debris will be removed from all sites as observed.
- An annual report will be provided to the City in tabular form as requested.
- The use of copper-based herbicides will be carefully utilized as necessary to target undesired algal growth. Aquatic Systems, Inc. will substitute copper-based herbicides with peroxide based and endothall based products when possible to approach each treatment with the most ecologically friendly outlook.
- Drift retardant and tracing dyes will be utilized on all sites, and at all times, for inspection purposes.
- Shoreline erosion will be noted and brought to the attention of the City as observed.
- Triploid Grass Carp are available to be stocked as a biological control for nuisance/invasive submersed weeds at an additional cost.
- Aquatic Systems, Inc. will offer Water Quality Assessments to be performed through our in-house laboratory as recommended, at an additional cost.
- Florida native aquatic plantings will be performed at an additional cost, as necessary or desired by the City.

Variables:

- In the event of inclement weather, hurricanes, or natural disasters, rescheduling will occur to resume our maintenance on the next possible day to ensure that all treatment requirements are met.
- Multiple field staff members may be deployed to assist in the maintenance and treatment of these sites on any given treatment day to augment our treatment efforts and/or to utilize multiple types of equipment as required to ensure complete maintenance events.
